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Our Founder

Dr. Charles Warren "CW" Williams, Sr.



Dr. Charles Warren "C.W." Williams, Sr., a renowned surgeon, was born in Hopkinsville, KY on November 15, 1925. He was an alumnus of Fisk University and a graduate of Meharry Medical College. After receiving his medical degree, he joined the United States Army and served as a MASH unit surgeon in the Korean War. Following his military service, Dr. Williams completed his surgery residency at Kate Bitting Reynolds Memorial Hospital in Winston-Salem, NC. He later moved his family to Charlotte, NC and established his first medical office, Northwest Medical Clinic.

In addition to practicing medicine, Dr. Williams held membership and leadership positions in numerous local and national organizations, including the Old North State Medical Society, American College of Surgeons, International College of Surgeons, Mecklenburg County Medical Society, National Medical Association, Sigma Pi Phi (The Boulé), National Association of Guardsmen, NAACP, Charlotte Urban League, and the Charlotte Boxing Commission. As a member of the Charlotte Alumni Chapter of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Dr. C.W. Williams established the Beautillion Militaire.

Dr. Williams was a trailblazer and a visionary, accomplishing many "firsts" in his lifetime. He holds the distinction of being the first African-American surgeon on staff at Charlotte Memorial Hospital (now Atrium Health) and was the brainchild behind the development of the Hyde Park subdivision in north Charlotte. In the mid 1970s, Dr. Williams, along with several partners, established East Independence Plaza, the first black-owned office building in Uptown Charlotte.

Dr. Williams' passion was for his family, his patients, and the community he so diligently served. He envisioned a place where the medically underserved and economically disadvantaged of Mecklenburg County could receive quality health care. In 1981, his vision came to fruition with the establishment of The C. W. Williams Community Health Center, Inc., where he served as the Center's first medical director until his death in 1982. The Center has been an integral part of the Charlotte community for more than 36 years and continues to provide quality services and resources to those in need.

Keynote Speaker



Bakari Sellers, Esq.

Bakari Sellers was born in 1984 and raised in Denmark, South Carolina. He graduated from the South Carolina public school system and earned his undergraduate degree from Morehouse College in 2005, where he served as student body president and his law degree from the University of South Carolina in 2008.

Bakari made history in 2006 when, at just 22 years old, he defeated a 26-year incumbent State Representative to become the youngest member of the South Carolina state legislature and the youngest African American elected official in the nation. In 2014 he was the Democratic Nominee for Lt. Governor in the state of South Carolina. Bakari has worked for United States Congressman James Clyburn and former Atlanta Mayor Shirley Franklin. He served on President Barack Obama's South Carolina steering committee during the 2008 election and is widely considered to be a rising star within the Democratic Party and a leading voice for his generation. He was named to TIME Magazine's 40 Under 40 in 2010 as well as 2014 and 2015 "The Root 100" list of the nation's most influential African-Americans.

Bakari has served as a featured speaker at events for the National Education Association, College Democrats of America National Convention, and the 2008 and 2016 Democratic National Convention. He is the author of New York Times Bestseller [My Vanishing Country](#) and a CNN political commentator.

Bakari is admitted to practice law in all state and federal courts in South Carolina. He is a member of the South Carolina Bar, Richland County Bar Association, and the South Carolina Association for Justice.



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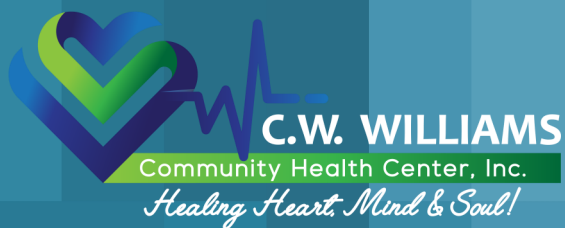

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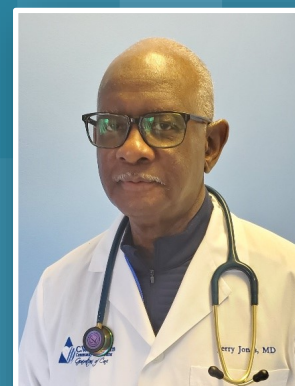
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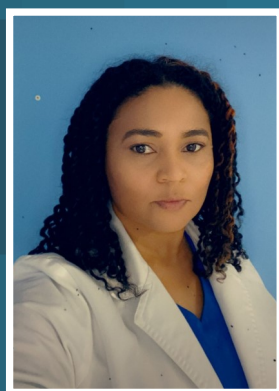

THE DR. C.W. WILLIAMS HEALTH SERVICE AWARD

Atrium Health's Biddle Point Family Practice



Carolinas Medical Center's (CMC) **Biddle Point Family Practice** was opened by Atrium Health in 1997 as a community health center serving western and central Charlotte neighborhoods. The practice includes physicians and other healthcare professionals who address challenging inner city problems, such as homelessness, violence, AIDS, teenage pregnancy, and other health and social problems at the community level.

In 1996, Biddle Point Family Practice created an urban training program to provide unique educational opportunities to those interested in underserved care. The track offers a novel and innovative family medicine training experience to medical residents who rotate through a combined family medicine inpatient service and off-service rotations at CMC. Each year, the program accepts three residents, who work with committed family physicians in a healthcare delivery model focusing on a team-based model of care and community involvement.

Physicians and staff are dedicated to providing care for underserved patients of all ages, from newborns to senior citizens. CMC Biddle Point Physicians include: Dr. Emily Cooper, Family Practice Medical Director, Dr. Christina M. Garcia, Track Site Director, Dr. Heather Burney, Dr. Talaya Clark, Dr. Nneka Hendrix, Dr. Cynthia Hill, Dr. Sveta Mohanan, and Dr. Shivonne Suttles.

HEALTH SERVICE LEADERSHIP AWARD

Dr. Martez Prince

Dr. Martez Prince began his pharmacy career at the age of 16 as a pharmacy clerk at an independent pharmacy before attending Florida A & M University, where he graduated from the College of Pharmacy and Pharmaceutical Sciences in 2010 with his Doctorate in Pharmacy. Upon Graduating, Dr. Prince relocated to Charlotte, North Carolina to work for a big-box retailer as a community pharmacist where he excelled amongst his peers in service and helping patients achieve their wellness goals.

After identifying corporate barriers that prevented Dr. Prince from impacting the patients in the manner he always envisioned, he decided to make his corporate exit to launch in 2015 the Premier Pharmacy and Wellness Center, an independent pharmacy with the community at its forefront. Through this company, Dr. Prince created a model that would earn him many awards in the area of pharmacy, entrepreneurship, and philanthropy, as well as the attention of Media Mogul Oprah Winfrey, who during her Vision 2020 Wellness Tour quoted his work as being "A model for the country."

In addition to his role as the CEO of Premier Pharmacy and Wellness Center, Dr. Prince serves on multiple community boards, including serving as Chairman of The Premier Foundation of NC, which he also founded in 2015 as a philanthropic arm to Premier Pharmacy and Wellness Center. To date, The Premier Foundation has provided over \$100,000 in scholarships and services to the community as an effort to level the playing field.

Dr. Prince has been quoted in more than 90 publications, including Black Enterprise, NBC Health News, and other notable media. Although Dr. Prince lives by the famous quote of Dwayne "The Rock" Johnson, which states "Success isn't always about greatness. It's about consistency. Consistent hard work leads to success. Greatness will come," he still finds time to enjoy life and indulge in some of his favorite hobbies, such as traveling, cooking, outdoor adventures, creating content for media, and helping others execute their ideas beyond conception. Dr. Martez Prince is a pharmacist who has a one-on-one relationships with each of his customers, who say that the doctor's advice has made a significant difference in their lives.

Rocio González relocated to Charlotte in 1998 and began a very successful Real Estate Career. She focused on helping Latino families achieve the American dream of homeownership. Ms. González has supported the Latin community through the Latin American Chamber of Commerce of Charlotte (LACCC) since 2004 as a member, Board of Director’s Secretary (2010 and 2011), full-time Director of Membership and Resource Development (2012), and past role as the Executive Director, and in her current role as Latino Program Director at the Carolinas Small Business Development Fund.

At LACCC, Ms. González was instrumental in a membership increase of 300% and earned the “2014 Hispanic Chamber of the Year Award” by the US Hispanic Chamber of Commerce (USHCC). She has received the “Community Service Person of the Year 2016 Award” by the La Noticia Spanish Newspaper, the “NFL Hispanic Heritage Leadership Award” in 2016, the Charlotte Business Journal “Women in Business 2017 Award,” the Latina-Style Magazine “Advocate of the Year 2017 Award,” and the “WC15 Power Award” in 2018. The Charlotte Transgender Healthcare Group



The Charlotte Transgender Healthcare Group (CTHCG) is a multi-disciplinary group of licensed medical, surgical, mental health, and other specialty healthcare providers who work with gender-diverse individuals of all ages in Charlotte and surrounding areas.

CTHCG was founded in 2012 with the intent to provide a forum for education and consultation for local healthcare professionals working with transgender and gender non-conforming individuals and their families. Additionally, CTHCG aims to provide increased accessibility to affirming care for our local community, as many individuals often struggle to find safe and affirming healthcare. The group's organizing mission is to preserve a foundation of education and consultation necessary to promote professional proficiency and growth to best support the local transgender and gender non-conforming population. CTHCG members participate in the education and training of healthcare providers, advocacy regarding transgender rights, and connecting and collaborating with other affirming community resources and organizations.

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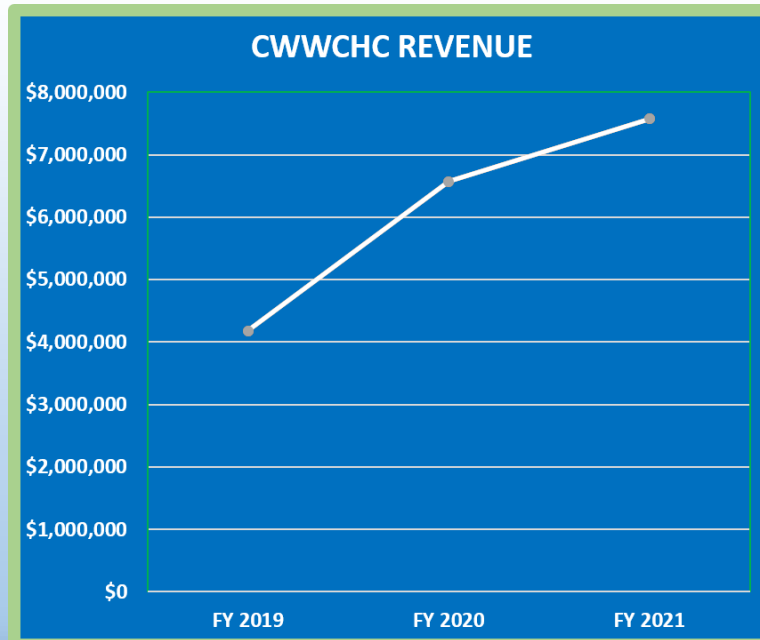


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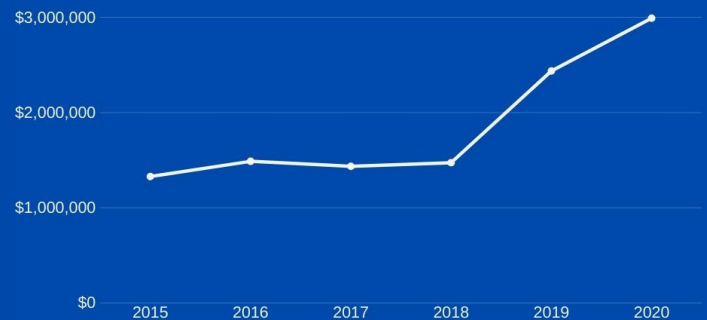


CWWCHC Clinical Services

The C. W. Williams Community Health Center, Inc. opens two new sites, launches medical mobile program, plans to build new facility, and provides COVID-19 services.

- ◆ CWWCHC recently opened two new facilities in Charlotte: one at 800 Clanton Road, and one at 5800 Old Pineville Road. These sites will enable CWWCHC to expand staff and services to better serve its patient population. CWWCHC also plans to build a new facility at its 3333 Wilkinson Boulevard location.
- ◆ To address medical and oral healthcare disparities and increase access to care in CWWCHC's service area, CWWCHC has purchased mobile medical and dental clinics. These units will travel to communities to provide services to vulnerable populations who face socio-economic, geographic, transportation, and other barriers to care. Stay tuned to www.cwwilliams.org for further details. CWWCHC is on the move!
- ◆ CWWCHC has remained open throughout the entire COVID-19 pandemic, while many other healthcare providers closed their doors. To date, CWWCHC has administered over 2,200 COVID-19 vaccinations and more than 20,000 COVID-19 tests.

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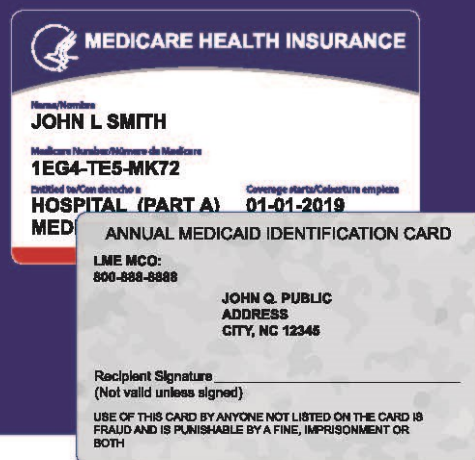
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
